The Word of the Cross

The Apostle Paul says in 1 Corinthians 1:18, "For the word of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." Because God's wisdom conflicts with man's natural thinking, God's wisdom looks like foolishness to him. That God would take human form, be crucified, and raised to provide for the forgiveness of sin and entrance into heaven, is just too simple and foolish in the mind of an unbeliever for him to accept. It does not allow for man's attainments, his merits, his understanding, or his pride.

As we consider this phrase "word of the cross" the term "word" refers to God's Word. The word of the cross includes the entire gospel message, that is God's plan and provision for man's redemption. Human wisdom cannot understand the cross. To those who are perishing, the word of the cross is so much foolishness, but to those who are being saved, it is the power of God. Those who are being saved speaks of believers who are being sanctified by the Spirit and who will one day be glorified in the presence of God.

The word of the cross is the power of God. Romans 1:16 says, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes to the Jew first and also to the Greek." The gospel is not good advice to people. It does not suggest that people lift themselves up. The gospel is the power that lifts them up. The gospel doesn't bring power, it is power. When the gospel is preached, the power of God is at work. This power is not aimless but is directed at salvation. The gospel carries with it the omnipotence of God, whose power alone is sufficient to save people from sin and give them eternal life.

This is something we need to keep in mind as we carry out our responsibility to proclaim the gospel. We are not delivering just some religious words. These words have the power of God behind them. And that power can transform sinners form the kingdom of darkness into the realm of light. It delivers those who trust in Christ from the power of death and gives them the right to be called the children of God.
